7th-12th Final Exam Schedule: May 2012

Students must be in dress code to take final exams

1. Only core classes will have exams.
2. For grades 7-8, there will be no final exams for PE, Bible, Art, Choir, Study Skills, Upwords, or Theater Arts. Teachers who want to give exams in these classes may do so the last days of regular classes.
3. For grades 9-12, there will be no scheduled final exams for Bible, Choir, Photography, Careers/Home-Ec, Art, Weight Training, or Yearbook. Teachers who want to give a final in these classes can do so during the last days of regular classes.
4. Exams cannot be given early; if a student misses an exam, they must make arrangements to make-up the exam with the teacher.
5. Students will not be dismissed early from a test period; they must stay in the room for the entire testing time.
6. While most students will only come to school for their scheduled exams, we will have at least one empty room used for a study hall during each exam period for those students who remain on campus.
7. All secondary students will be asked to leave campus by 1:00 P.M. each day.
8. All teachers will be available in their rooms until 1:00 P.M. to provide students with extra time to prepare for their exams.
9. Students must return textbooks to the book room (by the Coke machines) after exams are complete.

12th Grade Exams

Seniors will take exams during their regular class times on Thursday and Friday. Seniors will have a full day of school on Thursday, but will only come for 2nd and 3rd period and Chapel on Friday. They will stay at school if they have a 4th period exam on Friday.

State of California Laws on Health and Immunization Requirements

Do all entering 1st graders need a

"Report of Health Examination for School Entry"?

Yes. The "Report of Health Examination for School Entry" (PM 171 A) must be signed by a licensed health care provider and serves as health certification for school entry.

Do ALL 7th grade students need to meet the pertussis immunization requirement?

Yes. All students going into 7th grade must have proof of having had the Tdap booster shot unless they have a documented exemption. This includes current students, new students and transfer students in both public and private schools. Many students have already received the vaccine and simply need to supply proof to the school, so check with your doctor or provider.

SCCS job openings for next year!

- **Elementary Teacher** – A full time position for a 6th grade class.
- **ESL Teacher** – This position will teach two classes of English to secondary international students.
- **Part-time Secondary English Teacher** – This position will teach three English classes per day.
- **Secondary Boy's Bible Teacher** – This class is taught on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 10:45 to 11:45am.
- **Part-time History Teacher** - A teacher for three History classes including two 7th grade World History and 12th grade Government and Economics.
- **Part Time Spanish Teacher** – Will teach three classes of Spanish including Spanish 1 and Intro to Spanish.
- **Part-time Student Activities Director** - This person will plan and direct all student activities and events. This person will use leadership and organizational skills with parents and students to plan for student activities. This position has a flexible schedule with 20-30 hours per week. Due to the nature of the events some days and evenings are busier than others.
- **Part-time Chapel/Worship Leader** – Lead music with the chapel band for Monday and Friday chapels. This position's hours include Thursday evening practice to prepare for leading Friday's elementary chapel (8:15-9:15am) and secondary chapel 10:45-11:45am. This position has approximately 3 hours of rehearsal time with chapel band and 4 hours of time on Friday from the beginning of elementary chapel to the end of secondary chapel. Elementary chapel requires vocal and guitar and secondary chapel includes leading a four member chapel band.
- **Part time Lab Assistant** – The science department has science labs that need to be set-up each week. The position requires knowledge in secondary sciences so that lab can be set-up for science teachers. Lab hours are flexible based on needs of teacher's lab schedule. Currently the position has 6 hours one day a week. Great job for college student in pre-med program or potential science teacher who is looking for some experience in the classroom.
- **Part time Elementary Band Teacher** – There are currently 25 students in the band program. The students are taken out of their academic classes to attend sectional instruction. The hours for this position include 7 hours one day per week.
- **Part time Librarian** – Will manage the library staff and oversee the inventory of the library books. The hours for this position include 15 -25 hours per week with flexible schedule for days to work.
- **Yearbook Teacher** – Will create yearbook for both the elementary and secondary school. The hours are flexible and may include working from home. This person must be able to take photos, write, create surveys and use an Apple computer. Computer and software is provided. The hours for this position include 10-15 hours per week.
- **Day Porter** – This person will clean campus and remove trash from lunch tables. The hours for this position include 3-4 hours each day between 10am-2pm.
